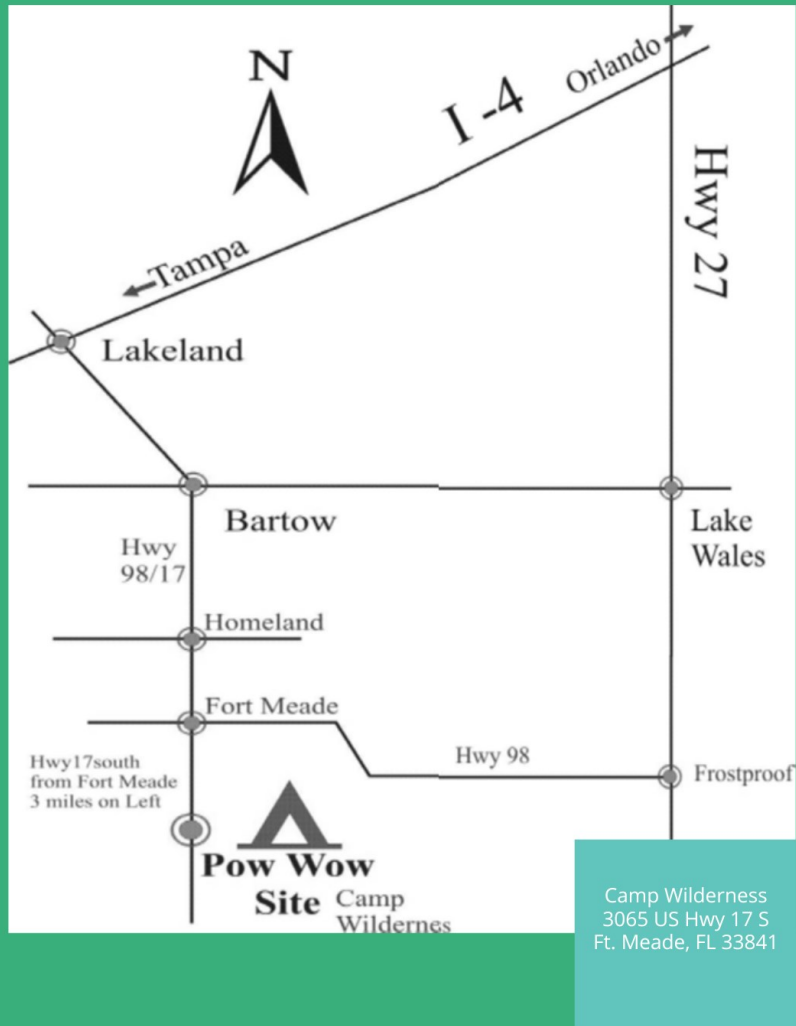

CAMPSITE SAFETY

- Name of Church at Entry
- First Aid Kit visible from entry
- Fire Prevention equipment handy (water, sand, and if using gas or propane, a fire extinguisher)
- Proper fire area- fire must be in a container
- Wood and/or fuel stored properly.
- Fire must never be left unattended!!
- Sharp tools covered
- Tool rack extra points
- Kitchen/cooking area clean
- Cup rack extra points
- Food secure
- All guylines flagged
- Flagged perimeter rope
- Clean campsite
- Sneakers neatly outside tents, wet clothes and towels hung up. Garbage properly disposed of.

Thursday Check-in

We will be opening up the campground on Thursday at 4:00 for you and your girls to come in and set up! This will give you some extra time to spend getting to know your girls better and build relationships within your group.

Campground will open at 4:00 for check-in. Gates will close at 8:00pm. So you must plan to arrive between 4-8pm (consider time to set up/darkness settling in.) There will be NO activities planned until Friday afternoon! There will be NO meals served until Friday evening! River/water is off limits until activity time on Friday. This is just an opportunity for you to have some extra time with your girls and relax with your own schedule and food.

What to Bring

Things to turn in at registration

- ☐ Medical Release Forms for Each Person Attending Powette
- ☐ List of Girls and Women Attending
- ☐ Cellphone Number of 2 Leaders at Campsite (Add on List)
- ☐ 1 Door Prize Per Church (Under \$10)

Personal Gear:

- ☐ Friday lunch or \$ to stop and buy on the way
- ☐ Snack Shack and Store Money
- ☐ Offering For Mission- Challenge Each Person to Bring at Least \$8
- ☐ Bible
- ☐ Flashlight (with extra batteries)
- ☐ Rain Gear (Poncho/Umbrella)
- ☐ Insect Repellent
- ☐ Sleeping Bag, Air or Foam Mattress, Pillow
- ☐ Close-toed shoes
- ☐ Closed toed Watershoes (for water activities, old tennis shoes work)
- ☐ Jacket or Sweater
- ☐ Clothing (comfortable play clothes, t-shirts, capris, shorts, jeans, water clothes.
NO short shorts or bikinis, if all you have is bikini wear shirt over it

Powette Basics for Leaders

- ☐ Medical Release Forms
- ☐ Permission Slip for Each Girl
- ☐ Secure/Dry Container for Girls Prescription Meds
- ☐ Medication List and Dosage Chart for Each Girls Meds
- ☐ First Aid Kit
- ☐ Port-a-potty Bag (Clorox wipes, hand sanitizer, air freshener, toilet paper)
- ☐ Bug Repellent (spray, citronella candles, thermocell, bug bracelets, etc)
- ☐ Rope/Twine, Flagging Tape to Mark off Campsite

Camping Gear

- ☐ Tents (Inventory parts BEFORE powette, check water resistance)
- ☐ Water Barrier to Place Under Each Tent (Tarps)
- ☐ Container for Campfire (half drum or metal garbage lid)
- ☐ Wood for Campfire
- ☐ 2 Pails (1 sand, 1 water for campfire)
- ☐ Matches
- ☐ Folding Camp Chairs, Carpet Squares, Tarp, Blankets to sit @ Camp/Service
- ☐ Clothesline and Clothes Pins
- ☐ Folding table to hold supplies
- ☐ Pails for Carrying Water for Washing
- ☐ Wash Bin, Dish Soap, Hand Soap
- ☐ Lanterns, Solar Lights
- ☐ Fresh Drinking Water
- ☐ Trash Bags

Rain Gear

- ☐ Tarps, Canopy
- ☐ Rope or Twine
- ☐ Large Garbage Bags to protect Miscellaneous Items

Things to know

- Please check the girls heads for lice before loading them up to come.
- Men who come as bus drivers will not be allowed to spend the night on the property. Men from the Royal Rangers department have been asked to serve on the Powette staff and will serve as security.
- The temperature drops at night. Bring an extra blanket to put inside your sleeping bag. Also, be sure that you have sturdy shoes, socks, and warm clothing. Shoes must be worn at all times. Enclosed water shoes are required for all water activities.
- Modest shorts and shirts please!
- We will be sitting on the ground for our services so be sure to bring something to sit on. Cushions or newspapers inserted in garbage bags would be good in case the ground is wet. A camping chair is great!
- Door prizes – Each group should bring an age appropriate door prize for Stars, Friends, & Girls Only. One door prize per church! Gift-wrap prize as desired. Place door prizes in box provided at registration.
- Snacks may be purchased at Snack Shack. Items will be available for purchase. We will be selling Girl Ministries Backpacks and lanyards along with other treasures!
- Contained fires are permitted for meals and after services if you wish. You must provide containers and firewood. Extra time is scheduled on Friday and Saturday evenings for “campfire fellowship!”
- Meal for Friday lunch should be brought from home or purchased on the way to Powette.
- Rustic showers and port-a-lets available for all.
Bathrooms/showers available outside walkway at lodge. These are for Leaders ONLY!
- Each CHURCH will have the option of bringing and preparing its own food OR the CHURCH may purchase meal tickets for food prepared on site.

Photos/Videos of Girls Ministries events will be used on the District website, social media and/or published in print form.

THEME: Above it All

“I also pray that you will understand the incredible greatness of God’s power for us who believe him. This is the same mighty power that raised Christ from the dead and seated him in the place of honor at God’s right hand in the heavenly realms. Now he is far above any ruler or authority or power or leader or anything else—not only in this world but also in the world to come.”

Ephesians 1:19-21

The object of the swaps is for girls to meet and develop friendships with girls/sponsors outside their church. Plus, it is a way we can share a little bit of ourselves with others.

Do’s and Don’ts

- Swaps should be handmade. They should reflect something about the person making them. It could have your church, club, city, etc.
- SWAPS can be theme related to Powette, club, or Bible. (Don’t limit yourself to these suggestions.)
- Keep them inexpensive, but make something you would want to trade.
- SWAPS can be pins or bracelets
- The size should be about 1-2 inches.
- Make a few extra; there might be someone who doesn’t have a pin to swap.
- There are two types of SWAPS. Those you keep and those you trade..
- The SWAPS you want to trade can be placed on your shirt, in a zip-lock bag, a box, or on a ribbon. Whatever is easiest for carrying.
- The SWAPS you want to keep can be put on a SWAP hat/bandanna/lanyard. Girls/Sponsors can put their entire “keeper” SWAPS on their hat/bandanna as soon as they decide which ones to keep.
- One should never say “no” to a trade, even if you may already have one similar or don’t like it. Politely trade it and say thank-you, remember Ephesians 4:32. (The exceptions are those swaps on a hat/bandanna.)

Any SWAP on a hat/bandanna/lanyard is a keeper SWAP and will not be traded.

No one should ask to trade those.

MISSIONS PROJECT 2024

Girls Ministries is joining together with WorldServe, *This Girl project*, to help provide dignity, health and education in challenging locations!

WorldServe has long recognized that women and girls are disproportionately affected by water scarcity. When water is present, great things can happen, especially in the area of education for girls. When girls are finally able to attend school, we want to do everything possible to keep them going! A challenge with which many girls struggle is the ability to attend school during their menstrual cycle. Inadequate restroom facilities, a lack of hygiene products, and rampant taboos mean that girls in developing countries miss up to four days of school every month. As absences add up, girls may fall so far behind that they don't return.

WorldServe International is working to change this for women and girls in three ways:

1. Equipping girls with a year's supply of biodegradable sanitary pads and quality undergarments.
2. Educating girls about their bodies through health curriculum presented with compassion and grace.
3. Employing women to earn a fair wage by working to sustainably produce sanitary pads for their local communities.
